

Strong Fall Storm

Heavy Rain, Thunderstorms, Strong Winds, and Heavy Snowfall Amounts Expected

Key Messages

- → A complex fall storm will bring heavy rain, thunderstorms, strong winds, and winter precipitation Today - Saturday (most falls today-Friday morning).
- → Rain changes to snow from west to east Thursday into Thursday night. Light ice accumulations possible during the Thursday evening commute.
- → Heavy snowfall amounts likely Thursday into Friday morning for parts of far northern Minnesota.
- → Strong northeast winds & large waves across western Lake Superior.

NEW

Important Updates

- → Gale Warning issued for western Lake Superior
- → Switch to mixed precip then snow occurring sooner Thursday.

Thursday


Heavy rain changing to wintry mix/snow, isolated t-storms south half. Increasing NE winds. Snow begins over north-central MN


Thursday Night-Friday


Wintry mix to all snow, with heavy snowfall accumulations in northern Minnesota. Strong north winds.


Saturday

Colder. North-northwest winds. Lingering lake effect snow along the south shore snow belt.

Some storms could be severe in northern Wisconsin


Impact Details

- → Heavy rainfall could cause minor flooding in northeast Minnesota and northwest Wisconsin.


Excessive Rain Outlook

Isolated Severe Thunderstorm Thursday



Rain to Snow Thursday Night-Friday

November 9, 2022 4:16 AM

A period of wintry mix including freezing rain is possible before the change to snow



- Along and north of the Iron Range:
 Rain changes to mix/snow on Thursday
 - possibly as early as Thursday morning.
 A period of freezing rain is possible.
- → Rest of northeast MN: Wintry mix to snow transition from west to east late Thursday into Thursday night.
- → **NW Wisconsin**: Transition to snow Thursday night. Lingering lake effect into the weekend.

Forecast Snowfall Amounts

Hazardous travel due to heavy snowfall possible Thursday night into Saturday Morning

Details

- → Snowfall amounts are likely (60%+) to exceed 4" across far northern Minnesota.
- → Highest amounts will be north of the Iron Range.
 - ◆ Some locations could see 8" or more best chance in northern Koochiching County.
 - Snow could begin to mix with rain by Thursday morning over portions of Koochiching, Itasca, and northern St. Louis County, with heavy snowfall rates possible Thu afternoon into Friday morning.
- → Lesser snowfall amounts further south.
 - Exception: South Shore snow belts could see 4"+ as lake effect snowfall lingers into the weekend.



Probability of Minor and Moderate Impacts

How to Interpret these plots: The graphics below are from the Probabilistic Winter Storm Severity Index. The plots below indicate the probability of each individual impact threshold, with the corresponding impact definitions listed below. The PWSSI is not a specific forecast of specific items nor is it a deterministic forecast. The primary use of this tool is to communicate a general level of potential societal impacts and their spatial distribution.





Strong Winds & Waves on Lake Superior

NE winds will increase Thursday and become northerly Friday and remain elevated

Gale-Force Wind Timing



Thursday through Friday morning




Occasional storm-force wind gusts (≥ 55 mph) may be possible, especially Thu. night

Wave Information



- Highest waves of 15-20 feet will be possible in the Outer Apostle Islands on Thu. night
- Waves of **8-12 feet** will be possible around the Twin Ports, along the North Shore south of Grand Marais, and along the rest of the South Shore Thu. night








Cold Temperatures This Weekend

Wind chills around zero expected

- → Minimize Exposure Avoid exposure during the coldest wind chills.
- → Stay Dry Wet clothing causes body heat to be lost faster. Wear waterproof insulated boots.
- → Stay Covered Wear a hat and gloves! At least half your body heat is lost if your head is not covered.
- → Dress in Layers Trapped air between layers helps to insulate.

Wind Chill is the air temperature equivalent in calm wind which would result in heat loss equal to the temperature and wind together. Body heat loss can cause frostbite and/or hypothermia.

What Can I Do?

Prepare Your Home

Make your home winter ready. Buy needed supplies before the storm arrives. Have a plan in case you lose power or are unable to leave your home.

Prepare Your Vehicle

Make your vehicle weather ready. Be sure to include a safety kit, cold weather gear, and all the necessities you may need to deal with the storm

Know The Terms

Winter Storm Watch: There is potential of a significant winter weather event. Conditions are possible but not imminent.

Winter Weather Advisory: Winter weather is imminent and may cause inconveniences.

Winter Storm Warning: A significant winter storm is imminent and is a danger to life and property.

Blizzard Warning: A significant winter storm with strong winds, snow, and low visibility is imminent and is a danger to life and property.

Ice Storm Warning: Dangerous ice accumulations are imminent
